I. INTRODUCTION

- A. Gift-giving is known from early days.
 - 1. Abram gave tithes to Melchizedek. Genesis 14:20
 - 2. Wise men brought gifts to Jesus. Matthew 2:11
 - 3. Mary anointed Jesus' feet. John 12:3
 - 4. Barnabas sold land and gave. Acts 4:36,37
- B. Christianity is a religion of gifts.
 - 1. "A preacher wrote several letters to a wealthy man asking for a donation. Finally the irate wealthy man wrote to the preacher, "All you think about is asking for money. Christianity is just giving, giving, giving." The preacher wrote a letter of appreciation or the excellent definition of Christianity."
 - a. Acts 20:35
 - b. Ephesians 4:28
 - 2. Christianity's existence is dependent upon great gifts.
- 3. The perpetuity of Christianity is dependent upon great gifts today.

 - 1. Jesus was given because God is love. 1 John 4:8
 - a. God's love is unselfish love.
 - b. The measure of love determines the greatness of the gift the greater the love, the greater the gift.
 - 2. Jesus was given when we did not deserve it.
 - a. Romans 5:6-11; 8:32
 - b. 2 Corinthians 5:21
 - 3. God's love revealed itself in action.
 - a. 1 John 4:9
 - b. "An African boy listened carefully as his teacher explained why Christians were such giving people A couple of days later the boy brought the teacher a seashell of lustrous beauty. 'Where did you ever find such a beautiful shell?' the teacher asked. The youth told her that there was only one spot where such extraordinary shells could be found.

"When he named the place . . . the teacher was speechless. She knew it would have taken the young man hours to walk to the bay. Also, he would have faced many dangers from the jungle and rocky cliffs of the seacoast along the way.

"Why, it's gorgeous and wonderful, but you shouldn't have gone all that way to get the gift for me,' the teacher joyfully exclaimed.

- C. His death was a redeeming sacrifice for sin.
 - 1. Man was under the sentence of death. Romans 3:23; 6:23
 - 2. Jesus redeemed man from destruction.
